



## An integrated city/harbour for the entire Metropole

The Metropole Nice Cote d'Azur is **the new licensing authority for Nice Harbour** since 1 January 2017.

This status strengthens coherency in managing harbours along the Metropole Nice Cote d'Azur coast, where it is already the licensing authority for 7 harbours: Cagnes-sur-Mer, Saint-Laurent-du-Var, Saint-Jean-Cap-Ferrat, Beaulieu Fourmis, Beaulieu Plaisance, Eze, Cap d'Ail.

Integrating Nice Harbour into the Ports d'Azur network helps in implementing the deployment plan to make ports of Azur **a network connected to a smart city and improve the towns/ports interface.**
